

2014 12U LMWPL TOURNAMENT

Hosted by the Lower Mainland Water Polo League

1) Age Categories:

12u

Location: Surrey Sport & Leisure Complex, Surrey, BC

Dates: November 29 & 30 2014

Times: **Saturday 8am-9pm and Sunday 8am-9pm**

2) Rules of Play

Except as indicated in the tournament package, the rules will be in accordance with the F.I.N.A. Water Polo Rules together with the F.I.N.A. handbook and the LMWPL Policy Manual.

3) Co-ed Rule

Each team must have at least two males and two females in the water at all times. If during a game, due to exclusions for major fouls, a team has only one female/male eligible player remaining, that team must play with one player short for the remainder of the game. If the remaining female/male player is then excluded for the balance of the game, the game is forfeited.

4) Tournament Tiering

The U12 Tournament is not tiered.

5) Team Composition

All players must be registered members of Water Polo Canada through BCWPA. Registration must be made by the date specified by BCWP. **Teams must be entered in the Events System on Water Polo Canada.** Teams may have a maximum of twenty-five players on their Tournament Roster, but may only have fifteen of these twenty-five players on any individual Game Roster.

Coach requirement: minimum NCCP Level I, Water Polo certified or CBET trained. A properly certified/trained coach must be present for all games.

Game Rosters must be submitted to the minor officials' table fifteen (15) minutes prior to the start of the game.

Tournament Rosters must comply with the following:

- i. Players cannot play on more than one team at any Tournament (i.e. Players can only be listed on one Tournament Roster at any Tournament)

ii. Tournament Rosters must include only players that are participating members of a club. For LMWPL clubs, participating members are defined as those players that have registered with a LMWPL club and have played at least 50% of the club's regular season games in an age category. For the purpose of determining eligibility, only one game per weekend may be counted in the total games played by a player. Players that also coach within the same club may count a "game coached" as a "game played". Games played with ineligible players will be forfeited.

iii. The submitted rosters for LMWPL clubs shall be signed by the head coach. It is the responsibility of the head coach to be aware of the eligibility rules of the tournament package. Players that are not eligible to play should not be placed on the tournament rosters.

iv. Special consideration may be made by a club, and may be accepted by the LMWPL executive, for players who do not comply with the above criteria. LMWPL clubs must complete an exemption request form and submit it to the league prior to the League Executive meeting which is held immediately before the commencement of the tournaments.

v. Protests against ineligible players must be filed with the League and the tournament managers *prior* to the commencement of the tournament at which the players are participating. Protests must be filed in writing. Protests for ineligible players will not be considered after this time.

6) Entry Fees

Entry fees are calculated on a break even basis to cover the pool rental and officials. Fees will be invoiced by the LMWPL Treasurer after the tournament.

Cheques are to be made out to **Lower Mainland Water Polo League**.

7) Competition

The 12U Tournament does not award points. All athletes receive a 'goodie bag' made up of items contributed by the Lower Mainland teams.

8) Ties : Games can end in a tie.

9) Equipment

All teams are responsible for bringing their own set of caps and warm-up balls.

Ball size:

12U – size 6008

Three game balls will be supplied by the host clubs for use during the tournament games.

10) Minor Officials

Each team must provide two persons to be a minor officials (table) during their team's game. Failure to provide a minor official may result in game forfeiture.

11) Officials

Officials will be organised in accordance with BCWP Sanctioning Procedure.

12) Awards.

Individual: No awards will be presented. 12U players will receive goodie bags.

13) Game Duration

Four (4) quarters each of five (5) minutes stop time.
Each quarter will be separated with a two minute break.

Time-of-Game clocks and shot clocks will be used for all games. Shot time for 12u games will be 40 seconds.

Two (2), one (1) minute time-outs are allowed per team, per game.

14) Team Benches

Teams will change benches (ends) after each half.

A maximum of eighteen (18) people are permitted on each team bench during the game: fifteen (15) players and three (3) coach or team representatives.

Coaches are allowed to walk up to 5 metre mark when their team has possession of the ball. If their team does not have possession of the ball, the coach must stay at the bench behind the goal line.

All of the substitute players have to sit on the bench during a game. They are not allowed to be in any other place other than the bench except the penalty box for substitution.

15) Forfeits

Any team not lined up and ready to play within five (5) minutes of the posted start time of the game will forfeit. Teams must have a minimum of six (6) players to start the game. A forfeited game will be recorded as 7-0 victory for the opposing team.

16) Protests

A Protest Committee will be formed and announced prior to the start of competition. The Committee will consist of the Tournament Manager (or designee), Referee in Chief (or senior referee on site), and a Board or staff member of BCWPA. Should a protest involve the Referee-in-Chief, an alternate committee member will be selected by the Tournament Manager. The Tournament Manager or Referee in Chief must receive all protests within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the game.

Once the tournament has commenced the tournament schedule cannot be protested.

17) Discipline

In the case of expulsion due to brutality, misconduct, or disrespect, an automatic one game suspension will follow. If any involved party disputes this incident, an appeal may be made to the Protest Committee. The referee involved in calling the incident must provide a written report to the Tournament Manager (or designee) within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the game. The report should be written on the scoresheet.

The Committee has the authority to issue suspensions from one game to the balance of the tournament. The Committee must also submit a report of any incidents of brutality, misconduct, or disrespect to BCWPA for review within 15 days of the date of the tournament.

Lower Mainland Water Polo League - Tournament Roster

Only players and coaches listed on the roster will be eligible for tournament competition.
Up to 15 players can be selected from this roster for each game of the Tournament.
